Pastor's Message

We have good news on the horizon. As many of you have probably heard, the CDC has issued new COVID-19 guidelines. The state of Michigan has issued updated pandemic rules effective June 1st, and an end to restrictions on July 1st. The Session has discussed the matter and formed a subcommittee to review our church policies. The two big dates for us, since we will start the new policies on Sunday are June 6th and July 4th.

Here are the changes as of **June 6th**.

The entire sanctuary with the exception for one section will be mask optional. The pews on the far right of the sanctuary will continue to be a "masks required" section. People are free to wear masks and sit anywhere, but if a person doesn't want to wear a mask please don't sit in the far right pews.

We will continue the social distancing of every other pew.

We are no longer discouraging those who are sitting in the mask optional sections of the church from moving around during the passing of the peace. We do ask that individuals to be respectful

of the masked section of the church.
 For those church groups that have not been meeting, church groups are now authorized to meet at the church.
 The building will be a mask optional facility.
 There are further changes planned for **July 4th**.

We will discontinue the social distancing of every other pew in worship.

We will continue having a masked section on the far right side of the church.

We will begin passing the offering plates as normal.

On the 4th we will celebrate communion as we have been with the individual single serving wafers and juice. Session will be in a process of discernment over the next couple months as to how to celebrate communion after the 4th.

The church will reopen to use by outside groups.

We have some long range plans for the

Our next PW Coffee is scheduled for June 15, 2021 at 9:30 a.m. Hope to see you there!





- A pen




What you do:
